The Artist as an Agent od Change – online course

Objectives:

The aim of this course is to explore the critical role of the musician and artist in society. The course will explore a set of ideas in the philosophy of aesthetics; civil society, philosophy of education, and ways that community music can play a positive role in social change. In addition, this course will explore various types of community. community involvement in different countries and different settings that have made music development and project planning a positive social impact. The course will also enable students to acquire the skills for setting up their own community music projects.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Upon successful completion of this course, students are expected to be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate how the Community Musician applies a critical understanding of principal theories, concepts, and principles in a range of community and educational settings.
- 2. Relate their music skills to a range of social and educational contexts
- 3. Develop an understanding of the relationship between theory and practice of community music
- 4. Define levels of involvement in the community and the limits of becoming an active agent in challenging social situations within the
- 5. Acquired a critical understanding of the core principles of community
- 6. Develop an understanding of how to approach children and the surrounding community.
- 7. Adapt methods of convincing parents and children to participate in community music programs.
- 8. Design an in-depth community music project by analyzing elements of existing projects and reassembling them (mix & match).

HarMA+ KA 203 Project

European landscape of teaching practices and pedagogical innovation in HMEI's - Music theory fields

This project created by Salvatore Gioveni promotes cross-border collaboration in the field of Music Theory through sharing knowledge and transferring pedagogical innovation. It thus responds to a lack of centralised source and framework to deepen reflection by means of cross-disciplinary study at European and international level.

There is a significant wealth of educational practices from one country to another in this sector, especially in terms of harmonic musical notation and analysis. However, Music HEIs are facing the nonexistence of a European network for pedagogical staff in Music Theory so far. To improve the situation, the project will among other things develop several *intellectual outputs* and *activities* to reach results in line with the project's objectives. We plan to particularly work on innovation in the area of music theory by:

- -Develop an online exchange platform on harmony and music analysis (IO1)
- -Develop a dynamic EU bibliography (IO2)
- -Develop a catalogue of new methodologies and practices (IO3)
- -Develop a Multi Language terminology dictionary in Music Theory (IO4)
- -Organise 1 training for staff and 1 intensive programme for students
- -Organise 1 dissemination conference and 1 final conference gathering at least 200 participants coming from HMEI across Europe and beyond
- -Foster transfer of new methodologies and practices into music theory courses
- -Strengthening the internationalisation of each participating institutions


WHO WE ARE

- A two weeks real experience (July) focused on Venice as a case study;
- Venice is a complex reality and it requires some specific knowledge and tools if students/observers want to read it correctly and understand it;



SUMMER SCHOOL 'The Shape of Water'

- Modules involve lectures, seminars, site visits, and labs;
- The school focuses on the macro-topic 'Arts in Venice' and is open to students coming from all areas of study (bachelor's, master's, Ph.D. programmes);
- Language: English;
- Especially thought for international students;
- International students will have the opportunity to experience higher education in Venice.





PROMOTING VENICE
