POWER TO EMPOWER: step-by-step to a safer and more supportive learning environment

The EU-funded PRIhME project is the first attempt to address how power relations can adversely affect our HME culture, our places of study and work. Power relations in the musical context are nuanced and complex because they have pedagogical relevance and can affect [mental] health both during studies and in the workplace. Between 2020 and 2023, 50 stakeholders from 9 AEC member institutions followed the Citizen's Assembly model of deliberative democracy, coming up with recommendations for the sector that they believe will make our environments safer and more healthy places for us all.

Led by the Chairs of the Assembly, Assembly Working Group, Editorial Board and PRIhME participants, this workshop will examine the following four themes:

- > Understanding Power Relations and Music
- > Sexual Orientation and Gender
- > Socio-Economic background & Disability
- > Artistic Standards

Engage in discussion on the PRIhME recommendations
