



The creative sustainable whole

How can you as a musician and artist make sustainability and green transition visible to your audience?

Liv shares experiences and comes up with examples of tools for how you as a musician can make your musicianship and practice more sustainable when it comes to: -production

- transport and touring at home and abroad
- -international collaborations
- -diversity
- involvement of minority groups
- -interaction with audience

For Liv, the sustainable transition is about much more than a green transition. In the workshop, the participants also get access to methods and exercises which we, due to amount of participants for this workshop, will discuss in practice and which the participants can subsequently take home and test in their own musical practice afterwards.

Liv Vester Larsen is a violinist, vocalist and composer, teaches at the Southern Danish Conservatory of Music in violin, ensemble and entrepreneurship.
