Teaching ensembles, there's a risk of limiting oneself using the same method over and over.

- and is that okay if it works?

I think it is absolutely necessary to vary the methodology when teaching in general, toaccommodate different learning styles - stimulating the competences in students: People learn in different ways.

How can we - while teaching ensembles - train our students in:

- playing by ear
- playing using sheet music
- harmonic cadences
- groove/swing
- sense of form/period
