


Growth of the programmes that allow you to find work more easily (eg new technologies)

THE ONE MILLION DOLLAR QUESTION

HOW TO FIND HOST ORGANIZATIONS?

Ask yourself the question: if I were a musical organisation, would I welcome a trainee? If you are not convinced, you won't be able to convince anyone.

Use your network of contacts.

Use the international network of your teachers.

Finding a destination and organizing a traineeship is an exercise in entrepreneurship for you and your student.

- Talk to students and get them to talk.
- Understand, and help them understand, what they can do and what they
 would like to do in their lives.
- Help them remember if they have recently met interesting foreign musicians.
- If they are planning a holiday abroad, suggest to make contact with local musicians and music organizations.
- Encourage their creativity and entrepreneurial spirit.
- Give them confidence.
- Make them understand that if they are motivated and convinced of what they want, they will be able to get it.

You will obtain two results:

- Maybe the student can have a good idea and find a good destination on his/her own.
- You will certainly have learned a lot about him/her and can use this knowledge to identify a suitable destination.

Devote time to your potential host organizations.


Devote time to your host organization during the traineeship.

Devote time to your host organization after the traineeship.

Even when it is the student who suggests a company to go to, try to create a relationship with that company and make sure to "build its loyalty".


Observations

- Great majority of students were recent graduates of Sonology and Italian
- Great majority of the dance students are Asian and go to Central Europe Dance Companies
- Half of all students went back to home coutries and almost half of those were offered jobs
- Motivation to apply varied from romantic partner @ the destination, to specific "company"/person to work for/with.




Challenges

- Overwhelming everywhere / anything
 - Networking / brainstorming
- Taking the first step to contact a "company" and devise and propose own services/skills
- Entrepreneurial exercise not for all personalities – some are too shy
- Business skills and negotiation exercise
 - There is always some small coaching involved in the conversations with students
 - Turn a challenge into a learning opportunity – negotiation is part of the profession




Challenges

- Finding a good "company" that wants them
 - Many companies are a bit reticent about which are their obligations
- Reassure companies about E+'s rules
 - sometimes I need to intervene
- Erasmus requires a minimum of full time
 - What is the best HEI's choice?
 Complying with rules blindly or fostering an opportunity?
- Deadline bad timing for dance students grant reservation – flexibility
- Funds we award 3 months max. also if they go for 12


