



THE CONTENT



Duration 1 semester/ 6 ECTS

- Practical training: instrumental and vocal interpretation, choreographic interpretation, sound and video production, staging techniques, use of elearning platforms.
- Theoretical-practical training: research techniques and reporting in ethnomusicology, transcription and editing, musical creation, organology and instrument making, pedagogy of traditional and popular music, promotion of the musical career.
 - Besides this, we have...
 - History and systematics of music from different local traditions, anthropology and sociology of traditional and popular music, musical heritage, musical iconography, etc.
 - Academic activities in connection with other training institutions (schools, universities, museums, research centers, etc.), and develop extra-curricular activities that provide opportunities for the training of students in spaces such as: traditional and popular music festivals and shows, collaborations with associations and professionalized traditional music groups, ect.

- Instrumental specialized playing skills, and a basic level at least in vocal and dance skills
- > Experience in ensemble practice
- > Enough competence in English language in order to develop the JM activities
- > Enough competence in e-learning tools
- ➤ **Teachers Profile**: specialist on Traditional/Popular Music from different fields (instrument players, theory, artistic managment, etc.
- Funding: activities can be financed preferably through the instruments provided for in the Erasmus+ programme, as BIPs and others


- > JM Coordinating Team: Made up of representatives of all participating institutions

What is the Online Platform?

A shared file repository that includes

- 1) material on musical tradition of each partner institution (history)
- 2) material on the musical instruments of each tradition (organology)
- 3) material on the music theory of each tradition (music theory, modal music)
- 4) material on the musical analysis of each tradition (music analysis)
- 5) material on interpretation techniques (performance)



Above all, it's a meeting place. Between teachers, students, teachers and students

Faced with the impossibility of a physical meeting (guaranteed only by the intensive weeks), the platform is a potential meeting space

The pandemic period and experience have forced many people to deal with the impossibility of a physical meeting and has led to the exploration and research of such tools to make the meeting happen on interpretation techniques (performance)



Role of the Platform in the project

- A central repository for sharing multiple types of digital files (video, audio, photos, sheet music, etc.)
- The main node of the network crated between institutions serving for live and interactive communication, musical practice and self-experience, connecting everyone and enabling collaboration between students and teachers
- Offering content for the intensive weeks (beforeduring-after)






Forming the LMS



Elements of innovation

- distance learning
- distance teaching
- musical/cultural exchange
- self/solo presentations and performances
- group musical performances



E-learning activities on traditional music

- Music ensemble e-courses
- Lectures/seminars on the pedagogy of teaching traditional music
- Developing video tutorials on learning/teaching traditional music
- Sharing audio and video of local repertoires
- Get acquainted with the music culture of each other



Actions supported by the platform

- to make music together
- to collaborate via the Internet and
- to connect with other students meaningfully

The main actions of communicating and sharing music involved

- Video recordings of national groups on their own musical tradition
- Individual video recordings
- Video recordings of different pieces of music, learned during the Intensive Weeks, interpreted by mixed ensembles



The Online Platform up to now

- The platform gave the possibility to students to communicate and share data (sound, video and sheet music), on musical traditions (in a national or local level) and musical experience
- The discussion meetings, arranged by instrument groups, offered the opportunity for dialogues on instrument techniques, performance and aesthetics
- Discussions about the need and pleasure of playing traditional music in the 21st century also highlighted their sense of being part of a unique network



The Online Platform up to now

- Therefore, online debates and performances that exploit and develop the improvised aspect of traditional music, have been a great challenge to revitalize it in today's musical practices and aesthetics
- Finally, exchanges in teaching methods contributed to the creation of new transnational educational networks for both teachers and students, and sharing repertoire, getting familiarized with each other's music culture.
