You will play a vital role in a range of projects. For previous role holders these have included a large digitization project to remaster performances from the archive and working very closely with choreographers to assist with the creation of dance films. There will also be regular checking of equipment: portable items available for loan by students and staff; and set ups within teaching spaces. Opportunities may arise to work closely with the Production department to support lighting and audio for some performances and student rehearsals, as well as potentially assisting and producing high quality live streams or recordings of performances and other events. There will also be regular contact with colleagues from the Faculty of Music.

Being friendly and supportive to everyone who asks you for assistance, you will have imagination and good writing skills for creating articles on our knowledgebase and responding to emails, have an interest in audiovisual technologies, as well as enjoying creative problem solving. Through all of this you'll be supported, be offered training, and encouraged to further develop your own skills and interests in relevant areas.

PURPOSE OF ROLE

- Assist the AV/IT Advisor to support staff in delivering teaching using multimedia and audiovisual equipment.
- Help students creatively use multimedia in assessments and performances.
- Prepare, upload and audit media files on our online streaming service, and support others to upload their own content.
- Regular checking and occasional maintenance of equipment.
- Plan, create, and edit new multimedia content.
- Assist with special multimedia projects.

Main duties

- Supporting and troubleshooting staff and students' safe use of AV equipment and software in teaching spaces, conference rooms, performance spaces, and the library. This may include providing some first-line support for any blended learning platforms that the institution may adopt.
- 2. Assisting students and staff with creating and using multimedia for assessments and performance (this includes video editing and exporting to suitable formats, as well as use of more interactive multimedia software).
- 3. Providing access to borrowable equipment and supporting the use of items.
- 4. Regular checking of AV equipment within the Faculty of Dance and reporting any issues that can not immediately be remedied.
- 5. Transcoding and uploading new content to the multimedia streaming servers, along with checking, adding, and amending associated metadata.
- 6. Supporting equipment use and the recording of classes, seminars, lectures, and events.
- 7. Creating and editing content on the self-service online knowledgebase and identifying areas where new content should be added.

This would normally be 08:30 to 16:30, or 10:00 to 18:00. Some evening and weekend working will be required during busy periods, for which time off in lieu will be given. Location: You will be based at the Faculty of Dance (Laban building, Creekside) but may also be occasionally required to work at the Faculty of Music (King Charles Court, Old Royal Naval College), along with other Trinity Laban sites. Salary: £9.18 - £9.50 per hour as per National Minimum Wage and National Living Wage rates for the duration of the contract.
