<b>Contract:</b>	Hourly paid, fixed term, subject to a 6-month probationary period.
<b>Hours:</b>	1.5 hours per week for 30 teaching weeks (September to July)
<b>Location:</b>	You will be based at the Faculty of Dance (Laban building, Creekside) but may also be required to work at the Faculty of Music (King Charles Court, Old Royal Naval college).
<b>Salary Scale:</b>	Grade 7, Precept B, Incremental Points 30 – 36, £52.23 to £61.29 per hour for teaching duties per hour dependent on experience. Salaries are paid on the last working day of the month into bank or building society accounts.
<b>Pension Scheme:</b>	The successful candidate will be auto-enrolled in to The Teachers' Pension, if they meet the qualifying criteria. Employee contributions are dependent on their monthly salary. The Conservatoire currently pays the Employers contribution at the rate of 23.68% of pensionable salary.
<b>Sick Pay:</b>	Trinity Laban operates the Statutory Sick Pay Scheme, and staff may be eligible for benefits in excess of this under Trinity Laban's own sick pay scheme.
<b>Staff Development:</b>	A range of Staff Development opportunities are available.
<b>Library:</b>	The Laban Library & Archive (Faculty of Dance) and the Jerwood Library of the Performing Arts (Faculty of Music) are available for use.
<b>Car Parking:</b>	A limited number of parking spaces are available at the Laban Building, subject to availability.
