As a specialist lecturer, you will contribute to the undergraduate and postgraduate Dance Science programmes at Level 5 and Level 7.

On the BSc programme, Performance Psychology introduces key psychological theories and concepts, examining the cognitive, behavioural, emotional, motivational, and social processes in dance in relation to performance enhancement, health and wellbeing, and career development.

On the MSc programme, Applications in Dance Science offers students the opportunity to tailor their learning to specialist areas. Students select two of the five components, which include: Strength & Conditioning in Dance, Movement & Technique Analysis, Dance Training & Education, Arts in Health & Wellbeing, and Psychology for Performance, Health & Wellbeing. The Psychology component aims to explore the psychological processes that underpin peak performance, and to provide insight into the individual and contextual determinants of performance as well as the specific psychological demands in dance. In addition to delivering the Psychology component, the successful candidate will serve as Module Leader, coordinating the teaching team of all components.
