1) The Higher Education Innovation Fund

- Contributes to the promotion and development of innovative, entrepreneurial projects in the higher education and the cultural sector in the UK.
- Part of the Funding Council of England
- Distributes public money for higher education to universities and colleges in England.
- Ensures that this money is used to deliver the greatest benefit to students and the wider public.

2) Training in entrepreneurial skills at the Guildhall School

Knowledge of the professional sector

- Course « Professional studies » : for music students only, part of the undergraduate program
- 3 compulsory aspects:
- > Teaching skills, workshop activities, community context
- Project Development and Management : performance or workshop projects
- Producing one's portfolio : CV, communication materials
- Student feedback : generally favourable

Communication skills

- Reflective journal: typical writing exercise to make students think and communicate about their own learning experience(s)
- Purpose: to record the development of ideas and insights, to reflect on the content of a subject and on the learning process
- Topics: related to class content or broadly inspired by issues covered in class.
- Audience : primarily personal and subjective

Training in outreach / community engagement

- 25-year Outreach program in partnership with the Barbican Center.
- Large number of activities : artistic and educational workshop projects in which Guildhall students are included (mainly Master's students)

Partnerships

- Guildhall seeking to develop partnerships with business schools
- Many existing partnerships with universities and cultural institutions: London Symphonic Orchestra, The Royal Opera, for example





3) Examples of concrete collaborative projects developed amongst students

Curious Festival

- Created by Barbican / Guildhall Creative Learning, featuring a variety of original works by Guildhall School Leadership Masters students, alumni and tutors and their artistic collaborators.
- Performances include: live music, visuals, dance but also installations, discussions and open workshops

• Cross School Project

- Takes place over a month of the second term of the Guildhall calendar.
- Compulsory for all first year Music, School and technical Theatre students.
- Divided in 2 groups, students must work in twos together to devise a short piece of cross-art performance.

coLABorate

- Opportunity for students to create their own cross-art work all 3 departments (Music, Acting and Technical Theater)
- 3 applications per year are chosen; successful candidates receive a small grant to help cover production costs.

4) Do you think this type of training has a real impact on the student's employability?

- Not data-tracked
- But a sense that it is important, because it provides a lot of opportunities to discover how to work with and in a team
- Still important for students to find their way and to define their identity
